OTIP Conference

This past week I attended the annual OTIP Conference in Toronto. In addition to presentations on current usage of our Long-Term Disability plan there were several workshops on mental and physical well-being. Did you know that there are health benefits to being thankful and showing gratitude in your daily routine? One of my workshops was dedicated to medical cannabis. Currently, medical cannabis is not being covered by our group plan, but it would seem that it will likely happen sooner rather than later. The evidence is clear that medical cannabis is effective in treating some conditions and once it starts to be available in gel capsules and has a drug identification number (DIN #) it will likely start to be covered. It was made clear in the workshop that the use of cannabis by those under 25 has been proven to have serious negative consequences. Once cannabis becomes legal in Canada, it will be treated like alcohol is by our School Board. I am sure we will be hearing more about that in the coming weeks.

Provincial Council

Six times a year, OSSTF Bargaining Unit Presidents come together for our Provincial Council (PC) meetings. PC acts as the governing body of OSSTF between AMPAs (the Annual Meeting of the Provincial Assembly). Last week Linda Schultz, Shelly Raymond and I attended the first PC meeting of the year in Toronto.

President Harvey Bischof addressed the meeting and spoke of OSSTF's strategy to deal with the Ford conservatives. There have been rumblings of "tying funding to achievement of outcomes", and a "modern relationship with labour" which is likely code for charter schools and more privatization. To paraphrase some of Harvey's remarks - We are not going to be the

loudest voice in the room, but we will be reasoned and intelligent. We didn't start this fight, but we are not walking away from any challenges. We will be the, "adults in the room." We will be offering support to ETFO in their recent court challenge against the proposed changes to the health and physical education curriculum. We will be working with other unions to counter anti-worker moves by the government.

Provincial OSSTF did make a submission to the recent Conservative Government Consultation on "Planning for Prosperity". OSSTF highlighted the following areas for consideration: Review the twenty-year-old Education Funding Formula, Amend the School Boards Collective Bargaining Act, Reduce School Board Reliance on Arbitration, Eliminate the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) and move to One Public Education System in Each Official Language.

Our Provincial Office (60 Mobile) is due for renovation and a plan was approved at PC which will see an environmentally friendly and sustainable transformation of our office space. There are costs associated with the renovation, but the plan will ultimately create a new building that will earn money!

Our official OSSTF charity for this year is Kids Help Phone.

October 11th is the International Day of the Girl. I encourage members to investigate hosting a Sexual Violence Prevention Workshop before the end of December available through Draw




Resilience
